LETTER OF HONOUR

Prince Dschero Chan "The Invincible" Prof. Dr. Chen Tao Tze was born in August 28, 1928 in Ulan Buha, Mongolia as the son of the renowned Prince Ghainur Chan and the Princess Timu Altan Cècèk "Golden Flower".

The name Dschero is the shortform for Edschenschoro, which is the name of a mountain in the "Land of Ordos" in Mongolia. At that place near the mountain Edschenschoro the mongolian aristocratic families held their ceremonies in memory of the great Gengiz Cha Chan "King of the Kings" and "Ruler of the Rulers" every year on the 21st day of the 3rd month.

Prince Dschero Chan fled to the Netherlands, where he arrived in December 1950.

He could only survive by changing his identity completely. That was the reason why a Dutch name 'Gerard Meijers' was given to him by the district-court in Harderwijk and his file had been amended accordingly.

He now fought for Queen and Fatherland as a volunteer in the Korean war and there it was where his European career started as a "Fighting-machine".

He is the first one who introduced to the Netherlands and also to other European countries Chinese Wu Shu or Kou Shu in 1952, Taekjon, Tang So or Kempo in 1954 followed later by Tai Chi and Chikong, Senkong, Wei Tan Kong, various Twe Na and Chinese philosophies "Foe-Loe-Tao" in 1962. In a number of Chinese disciplines he is the Father of Chinese Culture in Europe.

In the year 1972 he established the University of Chinese Esoteric in Mönchengladbach, Federal Republic of Germany and finally in 1980 the University of Chinese Taoistical Esoteric in the Kingdom of the Netherlands, in a place called Horst. This University became very famous in North-Limburg, and Prince Dschero Chan has already been called a "legend" by the Dutch Press.

Because he had very good contacts with persons in Taiwan since 1954, he began to love this country and its people.

When he met the renowned High Teacher and Scientist Prof. Dr. Sian-Teh Huang, to whom he shows his greatest respect, he became his best and most famous student and thus his blood-brother.

Prince Dschero Chan was the first man decorated with the 10th Dan in 1978 by Prof. Dr. Sian-Teh Huang, President of the WMAPEA and President of the National Gymnast Association and of the Chinese Medicine Research Association R.O.C.

During a press-conference in the President's Palace in Taipei he promised to work as an ambassador of culture in Europe for the Chinese people and their country. Furthermore he worked as a non-paid ambassador and paid everything necessary out of his own pocket. I noticed with great pleasure that his work was very successful. From this a very good and useful relationship was developed between Dschero Chan and the Far East Trade Office, The Hague, The Netherlands.

Prince Dschero Chan, who has also obtained the Chinese nationality, has always been strongly supported and advised by his Chinese wife Pi Wuan Lee. His house in Horst, Rubensplein 15 in Holland is the only house in the Netherlands and probably in Europe where the Chinese flag waves through day and night.

Prince Dschero Chan Chen Tao Tze received letters of honour, medals, certificates etc. from all over the world, including the Free Chinese Television Program 11:30, Police, Army and Ministries of the Republic of China.
